I like words that carry strength and determination; words that carry clear intent. There is a word that is used sparingly throughout the Bible, but every time you see it you clearly understand what it means and the intensity of the word. The word is RESOLVED. As far as I can tell, the word is only used four times in the entire Bible, and each time there is a powerful message. In II Chronicles 20:3, when faced with the threat of invading armies, we read, "Alarmed, [King] Jehoshaphat RESOLVED to inquire of the Lord, and he proclaimed a fast for all Judah." I love that! When some of the Hebrew children were added to the kings court and the instructions were given to offer them the finest of foods and wines from the king's table, we read in Daniel 1:8, "But Daniel RESOLVED not to defile himself with the royal food and wine..." He resolved to live a holy life. I love that! In Malachi 2:1-2, we read, "And now, you priests, this warning is for you. If you do not listen, and if you do not RESOLVE to honor my name, says the Lord, I will send a curse on you, and I will curse your blessings." That's a strong call! Finally we find in I Corinthians Paul's testimony: "For I RESOLVED to know nothing while I was with you except Christ and Him crucified." Powerful!

There's a verse that is used in reference to Christ that is a derivative of the word, RESOLVED. Let me offer it to you within it's context. We read in Luke 9:51 these words: "As the time approached for Him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus RESOLUTELY set out for Jerusalem." As I shared in a morning devotional, it's humbling and inspiring when you flesh out the meaning of this verse. Jesus resolutely set our for Jerusalem...for the place that would turn on Him and falsely accuse Him...for the place that would abuse Him physically...for the place that would condemn Him to death, and not any death: Death on a cross! He resolutely set out for Jerusalem where He would suffer and die carrying with Him to the Cross the sins of the world for all recorded time: past, present, future. From Luke 9:51 forward, Jesus moved with a singular resolve: I must get to Jerusalem for it is there that I will do what is required to bring redemption and the promise of eternal life to the world. Jesus was RESOLUTE; He would not be deterred, side-tracked or otherwise persuaded! He was resolved to save you and me!!

Peter, when He preached his first sermon in Acts 2 came to understand the RESOLVE AND DETERMINATION of the Godhead to redeem the world. He proclaimed:

> "Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which

God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. This man was handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. "Fellow Israelites, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. Seeing what was to come, he spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, that he was not abandoned to the realm of the dead, nor did his body see decay. God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of it. Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear." (Acts 2:22-24,29-33)

RESOLVE, RESOLVED, RESOLUTELY – strong words. It's this strong and immovable word that describes the intensity of the love of God to get to Jerusalem because He was determined to redeem you and me!!! Nothing and no one would stop Him!! I'm glad...and so are you. As we celebrate Good Friday and Palm Sunday in the days ahead, let us not forget Jesus' RESOLVE to save you and me... and be grateful.
